

Required Documents for Inspection by  
U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service  
Office of Law Enforcement Guam

Three (3) sets of Shipment documents are required:

- Declaration Form 3-177 (Ensure your form is properly completed and signed, refer to Declaration Form Instructions) **NOTE:** *If errors are noted on the Declaration Form, inspection of your shipment will not be conducted until corrections are made.*
- Copy of Air Waybill or Bill of Lading
- Copy of Commercial Invoice/Packing List
- Certificate of Origin, CITES Permits or Bureau of Fisheries Permit if Items are coming from the Philippines (One (1) ORIGINAL Copy!)
- Copy of Fish and Wildlife Service Import/Export License
- Copy of Designated Port Exception Permit (For CITES imports and Saipan Importers)

***Inspection/Clearance Fees:***

Non-protected species	\$91
Live non-protected species	\$165
Protected species CITES	\$216

Submit all documents to *U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)* 48 hours prior to inspection date.

Unless specifically authorized by this Office, ***DO NOT*** attempt to clear your shipment(s) with Guam Customs without clearing it first with the *U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service*. If you clear or attempt to clear your shipment(s) with Guam Customs without properly declaring it with the USFWS, your items may be subject to seizure and you or your company may also be subject to **fines** and or **penalties**.
